PUBLIC NOTICE OF PROPOSED SOIL AND GROUNDWATER CLEANUP

The Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) is providing notice in accordance with Arizona Administrative Code R18-12-264.01, that a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) dated December 10, 2008, has been submitted to ADEQ. The CAP contains a proposal to clean up petroleum contamination from an underground storage tank system at the following facility:

The proposed activities include the following cleanup technology that will be used to obtain the cleanup levels that are protective of public health, welfare and the environment:

Filing a Declaration of Environmental Use Restriction (DEUR) and Continued Groundwater Monitoring:

A DEUR is a voluntary notice to deed which restricts the use of the all or part of the property affected by the underground storage tank release in accordance with Arizona Administrative Code R18-12-263.01.B.4. The contaminated plume of groundwater will be monitored for two years to confirm plume's stability. The DEUR may be eligible for removal if the plume is stable.

A copy of the CAP is available for review during normal business hours at the ADEQ Records and Library Review Area, 1110 W. Washington Street, Ste. 140, Phoenix, Arizona 85007. ADEQ encourages public participation and welcomes comments on the proposed LUST case closure. A public comment period is in effect from July 8, 2009, through August 14, 2009. Comments should be submitted in writing by August 14, 2009, to ADEQ/TPD Corrective Action Section, Attention: Niles W. Keeran, 1110 W. Washington Street, Phoenix, Arizona 85007. If sufficient public interest has been demonstrated during the public comment period, ADEQ will announce and hold a public meeting.
