*The availability of the Administrative Records for
Former Fort Huachuca, Charleston Maneuver Area
and Artillery, Mortar Ranges and Maneuver Area
in Cochise County, Arizona*

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers announces the availability for public review of documents comprising the Administrative Records for the former Fort Huachuca, Charleston Maneuver Area project and Artillery, Mortar Ranges and Maneuver Area project, which are formerly used defense sites in Cochise County, Ariz. The Administrative Records are located at the Sierra Vista Public Library and at the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Los Angeles District office. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers encourages community members to comment on documents in the Administrative Records.

The Administrative Records contain documents which form the basis for the selection of remedial response actions. Documents now in the Administrative Records include the determination of eligibility, validated sampling data and remedial investigation and feasibility study reports. The Administrative Record also includes an updated application of the Munitions Response Site Prioritization Protocol, which is used to assess sites that may have munitions hazards and to guide future investigations or munitions removal activities. Other documents will be added to the Administrative Records as the project work progresses.
